Don Bosco Youth-Net (DBYN) is an international network of Salesian youth work offices and youth organisations which work in the style of Don Bosco. The network brings together 13 member organisations from EU member states. It brings together over 1,000 employees and 17,000 volunteers which cater for over 150,000 children and young people.

For us, the British Province has membership of DBYN so no matter what your background – school, parish, youth club or anything else - DBYN is for you. However, as much of the funding comes from the EU's Youth in Action programme, most of these opportunities demand participants are between the ages of 18 and 30.

Another key element of DBYN are opportunities to volunteer throughout the summer months – with opportunities to volunteer in summer camps in Slovakia, The Netherlands, Czech Republic, Spain and Malta amongst others.

Though we cannot guarantee these will be available this year – they typically depend on securing grants at a local level over the coming months – there's every likelihood these Salesian camps will be looking for animators (that's youth-workers/ministers to us) in 2010.

As you might have noticed, all of these events are happening outside the UK and there is a cost attached to this. For the seminars and training courses, 70 % of travel costs are provided by the organisers and the participation fee is usually kept to about 20 Euros. We recognise that this can still mean for an expensive time, so there's money in the pot to help meet your remaining travel costs (we also have a solidarity fund that you may wish to contribute too should you be able to). For the volunteering opportunities, the costs are different for each 'camp', with no guarantee of any funding being available, including for your travel costs. Please don't let concerns about costs put you off...that's why God invented *Easyjet* and support may be available from other sources.
